



## NEW Flood Mental Health Voucher Fact Sheet

The Long-term Flood Recovery Group is providing mental health vouchers for Boulder County Residents directly affected by the September 2013 flood event. Our intention is to help those with financial limitations receive the mental health services/emotional support they need.

The details of the program are as follows:

- Residents in Boulder County are able to work with the mental health practitioner of their choice, provided their practitioner is licensed or registered with the state of Colorado. Practitioners must be willing to contract directly with Foothills United Way with a form we provide.
- Mental health services\* must be provided by a licensed or registered mental health practitioner *with specific training and familiarity of best practices/evidenced based approaches in working with trauma, trauma related events, and PTSD.*
- Each individual session cannot exceed \$200.

### **Before using a mental health voucher, you must:**

- 1.) Make sure you qualify for a voucher by contacting the Long Term Flood Recovery Group at 303-442-2178 and complete a formal intake with a case manager.
- 2.) Upon acceptance, you will receive a contract to be signed by both you and your practitioner.
- 3.) Mail your signed contract to the address below for verification **PRIOR** to your first appointment.
- 4.) Make sure that all invoices are sent directly from your practitioner to the address below.

\*Mental health services include trauma therapy modalities, one on one, and family counseling. Due to the constraints of available funding, vouchers cannot be used for massage therapists or chiropractors.

*These vouchers are non-transferable, only valid while funds are available, and must be used completely by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2014.*
